Josh is responsible for the oversight of our audio and visual presentations of each worship service as well as other scheduled activities that require either audio or visual support. Josh oversees this area and selects and trains personnel to assist in operating the building sound and video systems. All sermons and auditorium classes are recorded and are available on CD by completing a "Sermon Request Card." Sunday morning and night services are also broadcast on local radio, as well as video presentation through various outlets. Repairs and preventive maintenance on sound equipment are under his supervision. Service is also provided for special meetings, weddings, funerals, and fellowship gatherings. **It is most important that if you are scheduling an activity that will need any kind of technical support that Josh be contacted prior to the scheduling of the building to ensure that support be available.**

The Pentateuch

One of my favorite movie franchises is The Avengers. I've seen the series as well as the movies that build-up to the series. For me, to have watched the entire anthology was most enjoyable since, as a young boy, I liked superheroes. Even as an adult, I still like superheroes, but they may be more heroes than superheroes. That said, if a person was to watch only one of four Avenger movies, they might be lost unless they'd read the comic books or took the time to watch the others.

I believe the first five books of the Bible should be treated similarly. When you read Genesis, you should go ahead and read Exodus through Deuteronomy. However, when most readers come to the later chapters of Exodus or the book of Leviticus, there's the tendency to throw in the towel. Even Genesis and Exodus themselves can be somewhat daunting considering that the events happened over 3,500 years ago in a culture altogether different from ours. Moreover, some people treat Genesis as a scientific textbook to answer how old the earth is. This wasn't why Genesis was written, so to thrust this question upon the book is to misunderstand its purpose.

This is why I've decided that beginning on Sunday evenings in March, I'm going to preach some lessons on the first five books of the Bible, otherwise known as the Pentateuch (Greek) or Torah (Hebrew). I want to assure you that this will not be a chapter-by-chapter, verse-by-verse exposition. If that were the case, we'd spend a few years in Genesis alone. Instead, what I want to do and hope to accomplish is to whet your appetite for these foundational books of the Bible by giving an overview of each of them.

If you and I were Jewish, every Sabbath in a synagogue, we'd hear portions of these five books read. Within a certain period, the entirety of the Torah would have been read in our hearing. Even our Lord explained these books in light of the revelations about Himself after His resurrection (Luke 24:44). While we are not bound to keep the regulations of these books, we must remember the purpose they can serve for us Christians today: "For whatever things were written before were written for our learning, that we through the patience and comfort of the Scriptures might have hope." (Romans 15:4). What we shall see and appreciate is God's divine plan from the beginning, as well as His trustworthiness in keeping His promises to His people and the multitude of ways He came to His saints' aid.
