An Unscriptural Celebration?

Having been reared in a Protestant church and my wife in the Catholic Church, we both carried with us preconceptions about the celebration of Christmas that until we were members of the Lord's Church didn't know were based in tradition, not in Scripture. Somewhere along our faith's walk with the Lord, we were much disappointed to learn that Churches of Christ gave barely any recognition to Christmas. Whenever I'd ask why that was, the answer was simply, "Because it's not in the Bible." This is a good enough premise to work from, I admit, but as I've studied the Scriptures, my tone has softened on this particular premise because there are a few things we do that aren't in Scripture. Now, you're wondering what I mean. Well, the song of invitation isn't in Scripture, nor do we see an example or command to preach messages that align with secular holidays (e.g., Mother's Day, Veteran's Day, etc.). One easy explanation for some of the non-scriptural things is that they are "expedients" ways to fulfill commandments that are given. For example, when Jesus told His disciples to "go into all the world and preach the gospel," He didn't specify how to go. Therefore, we can go by car, airplane, internet, radio, and other such manners. The way we go is expedient to the command to go. Make sense?

Here's why I bring this up: in John 10:22, Jesus is observed going to Jerusalem to celebrate "the Feast of Dedication." To the unaware reader, this is a feast and celebration not commanded to be kept in Scripture. We might even go so far as to say that it's an "unscriptural" holiday. We better know it as Hanukkah. This holiday is an eight-day celebration that commemorates the Temple's rededication during the second century B.C. when the Jews rose up against their Greek oppressors in what's known as the Maccabean Revolt. During the Intertestamental Period, these events are recorded in Jewish literature, none of which is Scripture. During this observation, Jesus depicts Himself as dedicated to God the way the festival's altar was rededicated, thus acknowledging this national holiday and its significance and even identifying with it (John 10:36). Someone might retort, "Jesus could do anything He wanted," which is also true. However, when Scripture is studied carefully, I've noticed that God never operated outside of the very law He gave. He was subject to it in every way possible, so He wouldn't be hypocritical and break a premise by which He bound Israel. Therefore, if Jesus could celebrate a religious-national holiday, you can too if you so choose. If you choose not, that also is your prerogative (cf. Romans 14).
